Our Mission

Founded in 2000, Equine Rescue and Adoption Foundation, Inc. (ERAF) is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, devoted to the rescue, rehabilitation, retraining and adoption of abused, abandoned and neglected horses. We work closely with Sheriff's Offices and Animal Care and Control units to identify at risk horses and remove them from dangerous environments. Our team of dedicated professionals, staff, supporters and volunteers work to rehabilitate and care for these magnificent horses so they may move on to their next chapter in an adoptive home.

Rescuing Thoroughbreds coming off the track

Calypso (registered name Strategically) was transferred to ERAF from a fellow Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited rescue facility, the Caribbean Thoroughbred Aftercare located in Puerto Rico. This pretty island girl is enjoying her retirement from racing and is ready for adoption.

Rescuing the abandoned and the ill

ERAF works closely with Sheriff's Offices and Animal Care and Control units to identify at-risk horses and remove them from dangerous environments. **Hope** is one such horse, coming to ERAF through Okeechobee Animal Care and Control. She was a malnourished feral girl; today she has blossomed into a beautiful inquisitive, gentle soul.

Rescuing humans in need

Begin Again is an innovative program launched in 2023 with a grant from the ASPCA Right Horse. The program evaluates and prepares ERAF horses to be suitable partners for equine-assisted services giving them a chance at meaningful second careers in facilities that provide these services.

Meet Charlie, a three-year-old Palomino Gelding, who came to ERAF through the Okeechobee Sheriff's Department as part of a neglect case. Charlie's transformation since arriving at the rescue has been nothing short of incredible. This golden boy's coat now glistens in the sun and the joy has returned to his eyes. He is participating in Begin Again Summer Camp training and is available for adoption.

Boogie was ERAF's Community Ambassador for several years. He was recently adopted by Tomorrow's Rainbow, a Florida-based agency offering individual therapy to children and teens who have experienced grief, loss, or trauma.

drew horse lovers in our community to the Lyric Theatre in Stuart for an evening of cinematic wonder and fundraising for ERAF.




